

Bulletin 1 - 22 November 2022

Welcome to our first bulletin of the First Actuarial 2022 Monkey World Cup. Throughout the tournament, we will be giving you regular updates on the latest happenings from Qatar, and the current standings in our competition to ensure you're all aware of how well (or not!) you're doing.

So, after twelve years in the making, the tournament hosts and debutants took on Ecuador a day earlier than originally planned in the opening encounter, in a game many felt would be a tight contest...

...It wasn't.

Qatar became the first hosts to lose their opening fixture as they succumbed to a 2-0 defeat, Enner Valencia bagging a first half brace with another ruled out offside in the first five minutes courtesy of VAR. Classically opening fixtures have seen little goalmouth action and in large parts this rang true again with the clash breaking an unwanted record of fewest shots in a World Cup Finals game (11).

Monday brought three more fixtures with both Home Nations in the finals getting their campaigns underway. The Three Lions kicked off proceedings taking on a not-to-be underestimated Iran side. Lengthy stoppages in both halves (24 minutes of injury time in total – another record) extended a close to perfect start to Gareth Southgate's men, as they romped home 6-2. Young WC debutants Jude Bellingham and Bukayo Saka both bagging in the first half along with Raheem Sterling. The second 45 (well 55 with added time) proved fruitful as well, with goals from Marcus Rashford, Jack Grealish and Saka again. An excellent start for England that, perhaps understandably given the score line, none of you managed to predict.

The second game in Group A came next with the Netherlands taking on Senegal minus talisman Sadio Mane. Despite Mane's absence, the African side dominated much of the proceedings, but it was the Dutch who eventually came out on top with starlet Cody Gakpo breaking the deadlock inside the final ten minutes before Davy Klassen rubberstamped the victory deep into injury time to slot Louis Van Gaal's boys alongside Ecuador at the summit of Group A.

Rounding off Monday's action was USA v Wales. It was very much a game of two halves with USA dominating the opening exchanges and deserving their half time lead, but some influential half-time changes by Rob Page meant the Welsh dragons roared into life in the second half and pulled level through "veteran" Gareth Bale's spot kick. The game ended a goal apiece, keeping chances of qualification for both sides very much a possibility.

Pre Tournement Trivia

It is of course the **Dutch East Indies (Now Indonesia)**, whose only game came in the 1938 event which was naturally a straight knock out affair. A momentous occasion for the nation I'm sure but perhaps one they'd rather forget as they were thrashed by Hungary 6-0!

Capacity conundrum

Qatar have built several new stadia for the tournament, but there appears to be some debate over how many fans they can hold. Originally the venue hosting the opening game, the Al Bayt Stadium, could hold 60,000 spectators but just hours before kick-off this had grown to 68,895. Eventually, 67,372 people reportedly attended the fixture, although the media reports of empty seats may convince you otherwise!

Results

There have been plenty of high scorers after the first four matches, with a seven-way tie at the top of the leaderboard and plenty sat close behind. Admittedly some are doing less well but as many repeat players will know, things can (and will) change fast in the Monkey League, especially during the fixture packed group stages, so still all to play for!
