### Argentina 1 – 2 Saudi Arabia

Day two of the tournament brought the first major upset, as Saudi Arabia – ranked 51st in the world – came from behind to beat Argentina 2-1. Lionel Messi (*who else*) put Argentina ahead with a 10th minute penalty, and the Saudis were firmly in damage limitation mode as La Albiceleste could arguably have made it 4-0 at the break. However an excellent 10 minute period in the second half saw the Green Falcons cement their fourth ever win at a World Cup, and make the remainder of the games in Group C at bit more interesting.

#### Mexico 0 - 0 Poland

The second match in Group C saw a stalemate between Poland and Mexico. Star striker Robert Lewandowski – yet to score at a World Cup – had a rather limp penalty saved in the second half. The next set of games in this group will be crucial, as Poland face a energised Saudi side, with Mexico due to face an Argentina side looking for redemption.

#### Denmark 0 - 0 Tunisia

Denmark were held to a 0-0 draw by Tunisia, with the referees and VAR taking centre stage as both sides had a goal ruled out for offside. A VAR check late saw a potential penalty claim, only for the referee stick to his original decision. One highlight from the game was the return of Denmark's Christian Eriksen, returning to his first game since his on-pitch cardiac arrest last year in their opening game of Euro 2020. Denmark face champions France in their next game, with Tunisia due to face Australia.

#### France 4 – 1 Australia

Holders France got off to a shaky start as the Socceroos (*arguably one of my favourite nicknames at this tournament*) went ahead in the first 10 minutes. However France's quality shone through, and within half an hour Les Bleus were ahead through goals from Rabiot and Giroud. Mbappe impressed throughout, and got a well deserved goal midway through the second half, following up three minutes later with an assist for Giroud's second which saw the 36 year old equal Thierry Henry's al time scoring record for the national team.

## Don't cry for me Argentina

I'm sure well backed Argentina would have preferred a more successful start to the tournament (and so would many of our Monkey League participants) but don't rule them out yet. Back in 2010 in South Africa, Spain lost their opening fixture against the Swiss but eventually went on to lift the trophy in Johannesburg, beating the Dutch 1-0 with a winner in extra time, but who was the goal scorer?
