Group G

This group provided plenty of entertainment on Friday evening as Serbia and Switzerland shared five goals, with the Swiss taking the game 3-2 to secure their place in the knockout stages at the expense of the Serbs who end their competition with another high scoring encounter.

An albeit much changed already qualified Brazil side were humbled by an eventually 10 man Cameroon in what could arguably be the upset of the tournement so far, although there's plenty of competition for that accolade! The Indomitable Lions ending the game a man down due to match winner Vincent Aboubakar's exposing celebrations landing him a second yellow card in the closing minutes of the game.

Brazil (as winners) and Switzerland (as runners up) progress to the last 16.

Group H

South Korea took on Portugal and Ghana tackled old foes Uruguay in the last round on fixtures in this group with all four sides in with a chance of qualification, but it was the sides mentioned in the first clash that progress to the knockout stages as South Korea shocked Portugal in a 2-1 victory for the Asian side to see them through to the last 16

In the other game, the Black Stars were looking for revenge for their exit at the hands of Uruguay (Luis Suarez) 12 years ago in South Africa. Despite losing the fixture 2-0, the Ghanaians managed to stop the well fancied La Celeste progressing any further in the competition as they add themselves to the list of high profile early exits.

Portugal (as winners) and South Korea (as runners up) progress to the last 16.

Knockout Stages

Netherlands 3 – 1 USA

Are the Dutch beginning to find their form at just the right in the tournament? The Oranje eased past the States on Saturday afternoon with first half goals from Ex-Man Utd players Memphis Depay and Daley Blind putting them 2 – 0 up at half time. The yanks pulled one back with 15 minutes to play but were dealt a blow just five minutes later as Dumfries added a third to send them packing.

Argentina 2 – 1 Australia

The arguably overachieving Socceroo's took on the other South American giant left in the competition in Argentina. Lionel Messi was on the scoresheet again alongside Man City's Alvarez as Argentina broke into a 2-goal lead. A Fernandez own goal brought Australia back into the game as they pressured the white and sky blue in the closing stages of the tie, trying to find the equaliser, but it wasn't to be and they bow out of the competition having given a very solid account of themselves, as Messi's men soldier on. Is it written in the stars that he will be lifting the trophy in a couple of weeks' time?



France 3 – 1 Poland

Kylian Mbappé once again stars for France as they cruise into the quarter finals after seeing off Poland on Sunday afternoon. The leading goal scorer of the tournament so far bagged a brace but not before Olivier Giroud became les Bleus record scorer. A consolation penalty scored by Robert Lewandowski deep into stoppage time was too little too late for the Poles who were outclassed on the day.

England 3 - 0 Senegal

Gareth Southgate's men appear to be back in the groove after the positive result against Wales in the week, with the goalless draw versus the USA now a distant memory. Three more goals without reply put down a marker to the rest of the sides left in the competition.

Jordan Henderson was on the scoresheet first before Harry Kane opened his account for the tournament just before the break as England toppled the AFCON champions. The everimproving Bukayo Saka scored the third in the second half to round off a dominating performance with little threat from Senegal in the latter stages especially, as the Three Lions progress to the quarter finals where they unquestionably face their toughest test yet against the reigning champions France.

Results

With the conclusion of the group stage and several knockout games played there's been plenty of change in the leaderboard but **Matthew Allen** remains in top spot. Shoutouts for **Gary Symons**, **James Milligan**, **Josh Titley** and **Peter Norman** who all managed to pick 12 correct sides that made it though to the last 16, more than anyone else, highlighting how unpredictable this years tournament has been so far. Extra kudos for Gary who was comfortably the weekends top scorer collecting 111 points, ascending to third in the standings – is the leader under threat?
