Argentina 3 - 0 Croatia

The first semi-final of this World Cup took place in a noisy Lusail Stadium, featuring players sharing eight Ballon d'Ors between them. The first 30 minutes went by with both teams looking evenly matched, and a slight concern over a hamstring problem for the player bringing seven of the Ballon d'Ors to the table.

The game changed when Argentina were awarded a penalty just after the half hour mark, when Croatian penalty shootout hero Dominik Livakovic clashed with Manchester City's Julián Alvarez. The ITV commentary crew all agreed it was a clear penalty, whilst the ITV half-time pundits were convinced it was never a penalty... Regardless of whether it was or whether it wasn't, up stepped Lionel Messi to put any injury concerns to bed an blasted the ball into the roof of the net.

Argentina in the ascendancy, doubled their lead only 5 minutes later. Alvarez again causing problems for the Croatians, waltzing through the defence and, thanks to a couple of fortunate bounces, able to lift the ball over Livakovic.

Croatia will have been glad to see half time arrive, hoping to reset and launch one of their charactistic come-backs in the second half. But it wasn't to be, and Lionel Messi tormented Croatia's new hot prospect Gvardiol, and linking up again with Alvarez to tap home his third goal of the tournament, and putting the game well and truly out of reach, sending Argentia through to Sunday's World Cup final

Argentina's last World Cup final was in 2014 against Germany, when Mario Götze grabbed the only goal of the game in added time. All eyes will be on the Al Bayt Stadium tonight to find out if they will be facing pre-tournament favourites France or the surprise package of the tournament in Morocco.

Going out on a high?

Lionel Messi has confirmed that Sunday's final will be his final World Cup game.

Messi has however previously retired from international football (in 2016), before reversing his decision, so could there be another U-turn on the cards?

Results
